10. New Business

 Authorize Executive Director to execute contract with Ryan Schneider Construction Inc. in the amount of \$52,000 for the Humboldt Bay Piling Removal Project.

Staff Recommendation: Approve a contract with Ryan Schneider Construction Inc. in the amount of \$52,000 for the Humboldt Bay Piling Removal Project.

Summary: The removal of 21 derelict piles mitigates for habitat loss associated with the subtidal mariculture prepermitting project. The District released an RFP for qualified individuals/ firms to remove the 21 piles within Humboldt Bay. Proposal were due by March 15; three proposals were received and reviewed by District staff.

b) Initial 2018-19 District Budget Preparation Schedule

Staff Recommendation: Direct Staff to implement the proposed 2018-19 Budget preparation schedule.

Summary: As an alternative process to establishing a subcommittee, the Executive Director requests that the Board consider budget review by the full Board in a series of regular and special meetings prior to the adoption in June. Staff would use the attached schedule to go through the goals, revenue, and expenditures by programmatic activity. These series of meeting would double as strategy sessions which would be used by the Board, Executive Director and District Staff to get a clear understanding of where each activity is at financially and what we can reasonably accomplish within our financial means.

Staff Recommendation: Approve Harbor Specialist Job Classification.

d) Consider Appointment of up to Two Board Members to the Humboldt Bay Regional Sediment Management Strategy Advisory Committee.

Summary: The Advisory Committee will include a well-rounded range of stakeholders including, but not limited to, local agency representatives, conservation groups, shipping interests, dock owners, fisherman, and general public members. The District Board will continue to receive regular status updates related to the Management Strategy and will be the ultimate decision maker on the PEIR, Harbor District permits and dredging contracts.

e) Woodley Island Marina Dredging Status Report

Staff Recommendation: Receive the status report, discuss, and provide direction as required.

Summary: District Executive Director and Staff continue meet regularly and are in the process of developing a long-term dredging and sediment management strategy. This strategy will be coordinated with the Humboldt Bay Regional Sediment Management Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) and other parties that will be dredging over the next several years.

Charles (Doby) and Kim Class, dba *FIRST CLASS* hereinafter referred to as "R. Charles (Doby) and Kim Class."

THE PARTIES, THEREFORE, AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. District shall permit **R. Charles (Doby) and Kim Class**, to operate the business *First Class* for the purpose of a Bed and Breakfast at the Woodley Island Marina. The Bed and Breakfast shall consist primarily of overnight accommodations and may include sailing excursions. Andrew Smyth agrees that neither the Humboldt Bay Harbor, Recreation and Conservation District, nor its Board of Commissioners, nor any Officer of the District shall be liable to any extent for the injury or damages to any person or property or for the death of any person arising out of or connected with Andrew Smyth, and Andrew Smyth shall indemnify and hold harmless District, its Commissioners, and Officers free and harmless from any liability for any such injury, death or damages. In addition, Andrew Smyth agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and hold District non-responsible for any of Andrew Smyth's operations according to the provisions of paragraphs 11, 13, and 19 of the Berthing Permit and Rental Agreement for Woodley Island Marina, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference as though set forth in full.
- 7. Andrew Smyth at all times shall comply and shall obtain compliance of Lessees' family, agents, employees, business visitors, and invitees of all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, including Ordinance No.9, the Woodley Island Marina Rules and Regulations, and those of local, state, and federal government.
- 8. Andrew Smyth at all times shall ensure that walkways and finger piers are not obstructed in any manner. No tires, ropes, canvas, or other material shall be nailed or attached to finger piers, docks, and piles without the written approval of the District. No person shall throw, discharge, or deposit from any vessel or from the shore or float or in any other manner, any waste, fish or shellfish parts into or upon the waters of the Woodley Island Marina or upon the banks, walls, sidewalks, or parking areas within the boundaries of the Woodley Island Marina. No person shall place or leave dead animals, fish, shellfish, bait, or other putrefying matter on or along seawalls, harbor structures, floats, piers, sidewalks, or parking areas within the boundaries of the Woodley Island Marina. Vessel must be kept free of trash and waste product so as not to attract seagulls, sea lions, harbor seals, and other

- animals. All trash and waste product shall be properly disposed of each day.
- 9. Andrew Smyth may place a sign on the vessel the size of which must be approved by the District's Executive Director. Andrew Smyth may place a directional sign for incoming traffic onto Woodley Island Marina in an area approved by the Executive Director. Type and size of all signs are to be approved by the Executive Director of the District and, shall reasonably conform in size, shape, and colors of the signs heretofore existing on Woodley Island and the Woodley Island Marina.
- 10. This Permit and Agreement is not transferable or assignable by Andrew Smyth without approval in writing by the District. Any transfer of assignment or attempted transfer or assignment of this Permit by Andrew Smyth shall be null and void.
- 11. This Permit and Agreement is non-exclusive and District retains the right to enter into agreements with and grant permits to other persons or business for the same purposes as set forth in this Permit and Agreement.
- 12. The covenants and conditions herein contained shall apply to and bind the heirs, legal representatives, successors, and assigns of all of the parties hereto; and all of the parties hereto shall be jointly and severally liable hereunder.
- 13. Time is of the essence of this Permit and Agreement and of each and every covenant, term, and condition, and provision hereof.
- 14. Andrew Smyth is hereby notified by the District that this Permit and Agreement to Operate *North Coast Sportfishing* in conjunction with the Berthing Permit and Rental Agreement for a vessel at the Woodley Island Marina or property interests created herein, if any, may be subject to a possessory interest tax or property taxation if created pursuant to Sections 107 to 108 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code and that Andrew Smyth and/or the party in whom the possessory interest is vested may be subject to the payment of property taxes levied upon such interests. Andrew

Smyth agrees and acknowledges that they have actual notice pursuant to Section 107.6 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code and that Andrew Smyth may be required to pay a possessory interest tax as a result of this Permit and Agreement to operate a charter service in conjunction with the Berthing Permit and Rental Agreement for the vessel for Woodley Island Marina. Andrew Smyth hereby acknowledge that they have actual knowledge of the existence of a possessory interest tax and have read the provision of Section 107 to 108 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code. Andrew Smyth agrees to and shall pay all possessory interest taxes levied by any governmental agency by reason of this Permit and Agreement and their Berthing Permit and Rental Agreement for their vessel, for Woodley Island Marina.

Subject: Call for Nominations: Special District Appointment to Countywide

Redevelopment Agency (RDA) Oversight Board

This call for nominations describes the process of nominating and selecting a special district representative to the Humboldt County Redevelopment Agency Oversight Board.

Reason for Nomination

In 2011, the State of California dissolved redevelopment agencies throughout the state and created redevelopment agency (RDA) oversight boards as successor agencies. As part of that same legislation, as of July 1, 2018, the more than 400 RDA oversight boards in California will be consolidated into one oversight board per county.

In accordance with Health and Safety Code Section 34179(j), up to seven members are allowed on each countywide RDA oversight board, one of whom "may be appointed by the independent special district selection committee established pursuant to Section 56332 of the Government Code, for the types of special districts that are eligible to receive property tax revenues pursuant to Section 34188."

When no independent special district selection committee exists, or when it is not feasible for the committee to meet, state law authorizes the LAFCo Executive Officer to manage the business of the committee by mail. Humboldt LAFCo has historically conducted a mailed ballot election process for purposes of selecting special district representatives to serve on LAFCo. For this reason, the California Special District Association (CSDA) has requested that LAFCo administer the operations of the Selection Committee to ensure a special district representative is locally appointed to the consolidated RDA oversight board. If the Selection Committee fails to act by July 15, 2018, the governor will make the appointment on its behalf.

Selection of Special District Representative

In Humboldt County, there are currently three (3) RDA oversight boards: Arcata, Eureka and Fortuna. Previously, special district representatives for each of these RDA oversight boards were "appointed by the largest special district, by property tax share" pursuant to Health and Safety Code 34179(3)(A). However, the new selection process outlined in Section 34179(j)(3) does not restrict appointment based on the highest proportionate property tax share of special districts. Therefore, the Humboldt County Auditor-Controller has provided a list of districts that have territory in the jurisdiction of a former RDA and are eligible to receive property tax distributions from the Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund pursuant to Section 34188, as follows:

TITLE: Consideration of Initial 2018-19 District Budget Preparation Schedule

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board: Direct Staff to implement the proposed 2018-19 Budget preparation schedule.

INTRODUCTION: The Budget is prepared annually under direction of the Executive Director. In previous years, the Board of Commissioners would approve the budget schedule for the next fiscal year's budget at a regularly scheduled Commission meeting and appoints a Budget Committee at their March meeting. The Budget Committee of two Commissioners works with staff to develop a preliminary budget and review the current year's budget and forecast. As the Director of Administrative Services position is currently vacant, the Executive Director has appointed the District Planner with the task of budget preparation. In accordance with CA Harbors and Navigation Code Section 6093, on or before June 15, the District Board shall estimate and determine the amount of money required by the Harbor District and shall adopt a preliminary budget. Per Section 6093.3, the final budget shall be reported to the Board of Supervisors not later than August 1st.

DISCUSSION: As an alternative process to establishing a subcommittee, the Executive Director requests that the Board consider budget review by the full Board in a series of regular and special meetings prior to adoption in June. Staff would use the following schedule to go through goals, revenue, and expenditures by programmatic activity. These series of meeting would double as strategy sessions which would be used by the Board, Executive Director and District Staff to get a clear understanding of where each activity is at financially and what we can reasonably accomplish within our financial means.

INTRODUCTION: The District solicited nominations for Humboldt Bay Regional Sediment Management Strategy (Management Strategy) Advisory Committee members. The Management Strategy will identify solutions for long-term management of sediment from Humboldt Bay's locally managed dredge sites (i.e., smaller channels, docks and marinas that are outside of shipping channels). The Management Strategy's environmental effects will be assessed in a Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR). Advisory Committee members will provide input on Management Strategy and PEIR documents.

DISCUSSION: The Advisory Committee will include a well-rounded range of stakeholders including, but not limited to, local agency representatives, conservation groups, shipping interests, dock owners, fisherman, and general public members. Solicitation of Nominations to the Humboldt Bay Regional Sediment Management Strategy Advisory Committee

Background

In Humboldt Bay, the primary mechanism for sediment management is dredging. Shipping channels are dredged by the US Army Corps of Engineers. Smaller channels, docks and marinas are dredged by local and private entities. The Coastal Regional Sediment Management Plan for the Eureka Littoral Cell¹ describes the following objectives for beneficial uses of dredged sediments from Humboldt Bay:

- 1. Reduce shoreline erosion and coastal storm damage;
- 2. Provide for environmental restoration and protection;
- 3. Increase natural sediment supply to the coast;
- 4. Restore and preserve beaches.

There are many opportunities to meet these objectives using dredged sediments from the bay. However, there are logistical and environmental challenges involved with moving sediments to the necessary locations at the correct times. The Humboldt Bay Regional Sediment Management Strategy (Management Strategy) will identify solutions for long-term management of sediment from Humboldt Bay's locally managed dredge sites (i.e., smaller channels, docks and marinas that are outside of shipping channels). The Management Strategy's environmental effects will be assessed in a Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR). The Management Strategy and PEIR are being developed by the Humboldt Bay Harbor District in coordination with the California Resources Agency, State Coastal Conservancy and Coastal Sediment Management Workgroup.

Advisory Committee

Development of the Management Strategy and PEIR will benefit from the input of interested stakeholders including:

- Tribes.
- Local, state and federal agency representatives.
- Conservation advocacy groups.
- Dredging interests (e.g., dock owners, shippers).
- Humboldt Bay users (e.g., boaters, shellfish farmers).

Advisory Committee members will provide input on draft documents related to the management strategy and participate in 1-2 meetings per month. Meetings would be held in Eureka, CA and via phone/webinar. Participation is expected to be from March 2018 – October 2018. Members would serve on a voluntary basis, without compensation.

TITLE: Woodley Island Marina Dredging Status Report

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board: Receive the status report, discuss, and provide direction as required.

INTRODUCTION: District Executive Director and Staff continue meet regularly and are in the process of developing a long-term dredging and sediment management strategy. This strategy will be coordinated with the Humboldt Bay Regional Sediment Management Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) and other parties that will be dredging over the next several years. As the Board well knows, the primary obstacles continue to be long fin smelt and eel grass mitigation at Fisherman's Channel and long fin smelt mitigation and environmental and financial feasibility of disposing dredge material from Woodley Island.

DISCUSSION: As the long-term strategy is developed and evaluated, permits are being pursued for the immediate dredging needs at Woodley Island Marina. One of the critical problems with permitting is that the only way that you really know what conditions and mitigation measures will be required is to apply for a permit. Over the past several years, the District has had several discussions with regulatory agencies, drafted technical studies, and evaluated mitigation alternatives. The regulatory agencies have cooperatively worked with the District to consider several project iterations and alternatives however, without a formal application and CEQA analysis of a specific project neither the agencies or the District has been able to come to any final conclusions.

As an alternative approach, the Executive Director has applied for a permit to dredge Woodley Island Marina using the clam shell method with disposal at the offshore disposal at HOOD's. Once the permit is reviewed and approved by the regulatory agencies, the District will definitively know what conditions or mitigation measures are required for that method of dredging and disposal. A permit does not require that the project be completed. A permit simply authorizes a project to proceed under the specific parameters of the permit. Staff is continuing to explore the cutter head dredge method with an upland disposal, and have told regulatory agencies that once the required long fin smelt mitigation is determined and the upland disposal site is cleared the District will very likely either amend the clam shell dredging permit or apply for a new permit as required.

The Woodley Island dredging permit application has been submitted to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for a total volume of up to 300,000 cubic yards over a ten year period. Dredged volume would not exceed 100,000 cy in any 12 month period. Ten year permits are being requested to give the District the flexibility to re-evaluate the facilities and shorten the recent ten year dredge cycle to avoid replicating the current state of the facilities in the future. The amount and timing of dredging is dependent on the District's available funding at the time of the project.

Permit applications/ requests for approval are also being submitted to the Environmental Protection Agency (for HOODS disposal), North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board, California Coastal Commission, and State Lands Commission. Review by state and federal fish and wildlife agencies and the national marine fisheries service will be conducted through consultation with above agencies.

In addition to the dredging application, District staff also submitted proposal to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to fund the installation of a 7 acre liner at the Samoa Lagoons site. The proposed pilot project involves improvements to the Harbor District's Samoa Lagoons dredged material processing site including installing an approximately 7 acre impermeable liner on one of the two dewatering cells and construction of settling basins and vegetative bioswales prior to water to be discharge into Humboldt Bay. The liner will allow for dredged material to be placed on the site, sediment dewatering, and on-site storage as necessary until the beneficial reuse project site is permitted and ready to accept material.

The Harbor District is the owner of a 21 acre upland disposal site that has an active Coastal Development Permit that allows up to 65,000 cubic yards of dredge material to be placed onsite; although estimated site capacity is even larger, approximately 100,000 cubic yards. The site was originally permitted and was used in the 1980's and 1990's. The California Water Quality Control Board will not authorize the continued use of the site as an groundwater infiltration saltwater dewatering site, due to freshwater groundwater potential impacts.

The purposes of the proposed project are to: 1) "reduce the costs of dredging and dredged material placement" (Section 1122(a)(7)(A and C)); 2) provide material to near-by planned restoration project(s) for beneficial reuse (Section 1122(a)(3)); 3) and establish a long-term site where material can be dewatered and temporarily stored prior to being transported to offsite beneficial reuse locations.

The proposed Lanphere Parcel/ Mad River Slough (MRS) Restoration Project, which is proposed by CalTrans, is intended to restore and conserve wetland habitat as further described below. Once dredged material is dewatered at the proposed Samoa Lagoons upland dewatering site, there are additional habitat restoration, shoreline protection, and construction projects that need large volumes of fill material which will allow the site to be reused over and over again.
