

HARBOR MAINTENANCE WORKER I

The Humboldt Bay Harbor, Recreation, and Conservation District seeks to fill a seasonal/part-time Harbor Maintenance Worker I position. Under the general direction of the Director of Facility Maintenance, the Harbor Maintenance Worker I position's tasks include janitorial and grounds-keeping work on all Harbor District related facilities. This position also performs semi-skilled labor- generally maintenance, construction and service-related activities, as needed for Harbor District Facility Maintenance.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES

Responsibilities and duties may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Clean restrooms and offices areas.
- Wash windows.
- Perform grounds-keeping duties.
- Empty trash containers on docks and keep docks clean.
- Assist in emergency and rescue efforts in the harbor area.
- Operate equipment and power tools such as pumps, forklift, mowers, edgers and blowers and others; maintain hand tools and assigned equipment.
- Utilize proper safety precautions related to all work performs.
- Maintain records related to the assigned areas of responsibility.
- Respond to requests and inquiries from the general public.
- Perform routine maintenance and repairs on various Harbor District structures and facilities as directed.
- Assist in the regular preventative maintenance programs set by performing scheduled checks and reporting results.
- Assist in the enforcement of laws, rules and regulations concerning the use of Harbor District facilities.
- Perform related duties and responsibilities as required.

QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of:

- General custodial practices.
- Plant care/landscape techniques.
- Small boat safety and maintenance.
- Methods and techniques of construction, maintenance, and repair related to harbor facilities.
- Operational characteristics of mechanical equipment and tools used in the assigned area of responsibility.
- Safe work practices.

Ability to:

- Work outdoors in cold and wet conditions and during hours of daylight and darkness.
- Possess sufficient strength and stamina to lift and carry objects weighing up to 70 lbs. and perform -sustained heavy physical labor.
- Perform custodial duties and semi-skilled maintenance work on harbor facilities and equipment.
- Operate a variety of vehicular and stationary mechanical equipment in a safe and effective manner in routine situations.
- Work independently in the absence of supervision.
- Use and operate hand tools, mechanical equipment, and power tools and equipment required for the work in a safe and efficient manner.
- Perform heavy manual labor.
- Follow both written and oral directions.
- Communicate clearly and concisely, both orally and in writing.

EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING GUIDELINES

Any combination of experience and training that would likely provide the required knowledge and abilities is qualifying. A typical way would be:

Education:

High school graduation or equivalent.

Experience:

Three years of increasingly responsible experience performing custodial and grounds keeping duties with limited maintenance experience.

Training:

Formal or informal education and training which ensures the ability to read and write at a level necessary for successful job performance.

LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE

- Possession of, or ability to obtain, an appropriate:
 - Valid California Driver's License, and
 - Hazwoper Certificate, and
 - Red Cross First Aid Training Certificate with Adult CPR
