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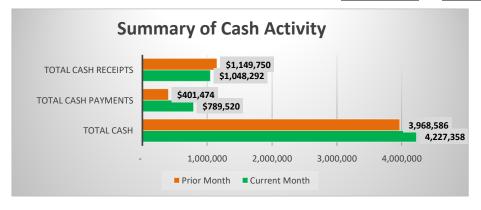

**Eradication Plan Continued Implementation** 

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:** Staff recommends that the Board: Accept Permit Application 2024-04 for filing.

**SUMMARY:** The Humboldt Bay Regional Spartina Eradication Plan (Regional Plan) provides a framework for eradicating invasive *Spartina densiflora* (dense-flowered cordgrass) at a regional level using a coordinated strategic approach that has been underway since the early 2000s. The Regional Plan continues to be effectively implemented. The existing Harbor District Permit 2014-05 for this project expires on 12/18/2024. The Project remains consistent with the approved project description. This application requests a new Harbor District Permit for the ongoing project activities as fully described in the Regional Plan.

Consistent with District Ordinances and the Harbors and Navigation Code, this is a procedural step to accept a permit application to conduct physical improvements within the waters of Humboldt Bay. If the Board chooses to accept the filing of this permit, staff will follow standard procedures to review and evaluate the project. Following that analysis, the project will come before the Board with a staff recommendation for or against approval.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The Humboldt Bay Regional Invasive Spartina Eradication Project is a collaborative effort aimed at removing *Spartina* to restore and protect sensitive tidal marsh habitats in the region. Coordinated by the Humboldt Bay Harbor, Recreation, and Conservation District, the project involves partnerships with the Wiyot Tribe, Caltrans, Humboldt Bay National Wildlife Refuge, the City of Arcata, Redwood Community Action Agency (RCAA), the State Coastal Conservancy, and other stakeholders. These groups continue to work together to remove the invasive *Spartina* from tidal marshes around Humboldt Bay.

The invasive *Spartina* has infested significant portions of the tidal marshes (as much as 90% of Humboldt Bay's remnant salt marshes were affected in 2001), excluding native plant species, disrupting the benthic macroinvertebrate community, reducing primary productivity, and threatening to transform vital mudflats into salt marsh. The removal of *Spartina* is critical for preserving native biodiversity, preventing further habitat degradation,

and protecting crucial foraging areas for shorebirds and waterfowl. The Regional Plan has been successfully implemented over the past 10 years in tidal marshes, and, to a much lesser extent, mudflats of Humboldt Bay, the Eel River estuary, and the Mad River estuary. Site-specific plans for each of the proposed treatment areas in any given year are developed and include a description of the specific measures that will assure the restoration of native tidal marsh plant species in the treatment area, and how the mitigation measures detailed in the Final PEIR and special conditions of the CDP will be implemented at each location.

The project uses a combination of mechanical and chemical treatments, including specialized equipment like brush cutters and an amphibious Marsh Master, to remove *Spartina* from these areas. In 2013, a Programmatic Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) was developed and certified to streamline permitting and facilitate efficient eradication efforts. The PEIR project area (the Management Area) is the Humboldt Bay region which is defined as the area spanning from the Mad River to the north, the Eel River delta to the south, and includes the mouths of rivers, sloughs, estuaries, and tidal channels within Humboldt Bay. Key areas of concern include Eel River Estuary, Mad River Estuary, Mad River Slough, McDaniel Slough, Jacoby Creek, Eureka Slough, Salmon Creek, Hookton Slough, and the Salt River. **TITLE:** Consider Approval of a Contract with the Federal Maritime Administration (MARAD) to Receive a \$8,672,986 Grant for the Redwood Marine Heavy Lift Marine Terminal Project

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:** Authorize the Executive Director to sign the funding agreement with MARAD.

**SUMMARY:** On 4/6/23 the Board adopted Harbor District Resolution 2023-07, which authorized the District to submit an application to the Federal PIDP program and authorized the expenditure of matching funds (to be drawn from the \$10.45M CEC grant). On 4/28/24, the District submitted the authorized PIDP grant application. On 11/9/23, the District was awarded the PIDP grant. The District now needs to enter into a grant agreement with MARAD.

**DISCUSSION:** The State's FY 21/22 budget included an allocation of \$10,450,000 to the Harbor District to be used for "port development in the County of Humboldt to allow for offshore wind energy." A portion of those funds are designated to be used as a "pledge as matching funds in the District's applications for federal funds for the Humboldt port offshore wind upgrade." Based on Resolution 2023-07, the District pledged \$2,253,074 of those funds to match a \$8,672,986 grant to the Federal Maritime Administration (MARAD). The District was awarded that federal grant and has completed all procedural requirements to initiate the spending of that grant, including the issuance of a competitive RFQ and the competitive selection of Moffatt & Nichol to complete the project. The Board authorized the Executive Director to enter into a contract with Moffatt & Nichol. The only step remaining is to authorize the Executive Director to sign the grant agreement with MARAD.

TITLE: Authorize the extension of the Real Property Lease with Redwood Restaurants for a period of Ten (10) additional years

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:** Staff recommends that the Board authorize an extension of the Real Property Lease with Fresh Freeze Supply, Inc for ten (10) additional years.

**SUMMARY:** Fresh Freeze Supply, Inc dba Café Marnina has been an anchor tenant on Woodley Island since the beginning. Over the past several decades, Café Marina has presented a prominent casual dining option for our community while routinely investing in tenant improvements and the overall facility.

**DISCUSSION:** Whereas the Café Marina is a community staple, and the café has been in continuous operation for four decades, the owner has expressed a desire to remodel and modernize the restaurant. Such improvements will occur in phases over the 2025 calendar year, with a proposed commencement in January. The investment committed by the operator totals \$100,000.00 and involves significant equipment and facility upgrades.

### AGREEMENT TO RENEW LEASE

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:** Staff recommends that the Board Adopt Resolution 2024-09 and authorize the Executive Director to execute a grant agreement with the California Natural Resources Agency, Division of Boating and Waterways.

**SUMMARY**: Abandoned, surrendered, and derelict vessels are in harbors and waters throughout California; Humboldt Bay is no exception. Periodically, vessels are eligible for funding under the SAVE Grant program to be removed, stripped of recyclables, and then the remainder adequately disposed of. The Harbor District has partnered with the City of Eureka with support from the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office, California Department of Fish & Wildlife, and the United States Coast Guard for many years to remove abandoned and surrendered vessels from local waterways. In the most recent offering, the District has been awarded a SAVE 24 Grant in the amount of \$30,000.

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2024-09**

A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTION OF A GRANT AGREEMENT AND ACCEPT FUNDS FROM THE CALIFORNIA NATURAL RESOURCES AGENCY DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION DIVISION OF BOATING AND WATERWAYS FOR THE SURRENDERED AND ABANDONED VESSEL EXCHANGE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the State of California Harbors and Navigation Code section 525 authorizes the California Natural Resources Agency Department of Parks and Recreation Division of Boating and Waterways ("DBW") to appropriate funds for the Abandoned Watercraft Abatement Fund and the Vessel Turn-In Program. The Abandoned Watercraft Abatement Fund and the Vessel Turn-In Program have been combined into the Surrendered and Abandoned Vessel Exchange ("SAVE") Grant Program;

WHEREAS, the Humboldt Bay Harbor, Recreation and Conservation District ("District") owns and operates the Woodley Island Marina, Fields Landing Boat Yard, Redwood Marine Terminals I and II, and King Salmon Fisherman's Channel, and is a qualified local government agency with jurisdiction over navigable waters in California eligible for grant funding under the SAVE Program;

**WHEREAS,** there are currently abandoned, surrendered and/or derelict vessels located at District facilities eligible under the SAVE Grant;

**WHEREAS,** in April 2024 the District submitted an application to the SAVE Program for funding to appropriately dispose of up to six (6) of those vessels;

**WHEREAS,** the DBW has awarded a SAVE grant to the District in the amount of \$30,000 for the removal and appropriate disposal of surrendered and abandoned vessels; and

**WHEREAS,** the procedures established by the DBW require a resolution from the District authorizing the execution of the SAVE Grant Agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Commissioners of the Humboldt Bay Harbor, Recreation and Conservation District hereby:

- 1. Accepts the award of a SAVE Program Grant in the amount of \$30,000 from the California Natural Resources Agency Department of Parks and Recreation Division of Boating and Waterways.
- 2. Certifies that the District has reviewed, understands, and agrees to the provisions contained in the grant agreement.
- 3. Delegates the authority to the Executive Director, or his designee, to execute the grant agreement and any subsequent amendments with the

State of California for the purposes of this grant, and to execute all other documents needed in connection with the SAVE Grant

Program; and

4. Authorizes a 10% cash or in-kind contribution of District Funds in the amount of \$3,000.
